GOLD Acting Exams!

FOR the first time *CENTRESTAGE* is entering candidates at Gold Medal level for LAMDA Exams. On Sunday 12th July, 6 students will enter examinations for their Bronze medal Acting, 1 student will take Grade 5 and 6 students will enter Gold medal Acting.

One of these students, a certain Rose Dunne, who has just finished Year 13, attended the very first lesson that Rebekah taught 11 years ago at what would become *CENTRESTAGE*.

All medal examinations carry UCAS points: a distinction at Bronze medal carries 40 points, which is the equivalent to a 'C' grade at AS level, whilst a distinction at Silver is the equivalent of an A- at AS level (55 points) and a distinction at Gold counts as a B- at A2 level (90 points).

So these examinations give older students the chance to pursue their interests, whilst getting an accreditation recognised by universities. It's great to know you've got some extra points already in the bag when you're sitting in that exam hall!
